


Today and Tomorrow's Weather

Mostly dry conditions are expected today with gentle to moderate winds and slight seas expected across the Gulf. High-pressure will dominate the region through the weekend with winds shifting to be out of the southeast with increasing winds up to fresh speeds expected by the late weekend.


Day Three through Seven Weather Hazards

The pressure gradient will tighten once again early next week thanks to another storm system forming over the central US. Winds will become sustained at 15-25 knots for days 4-6 with gusts in excess of 30 knots. Seas will build to 5-7 feet for the early week before creeping into rough territory for days 5-6 at 7-9 feet. By middle to late week next week, another potential system could enter the region bringing widespread showers, storms, and elevated winds and seas across the region.


This Morning's Winds and Seas




This Evening's Winds and Seas




Tomorrow Morning's Winds and Seas




Tomorrow Evening's Winds and Seas




