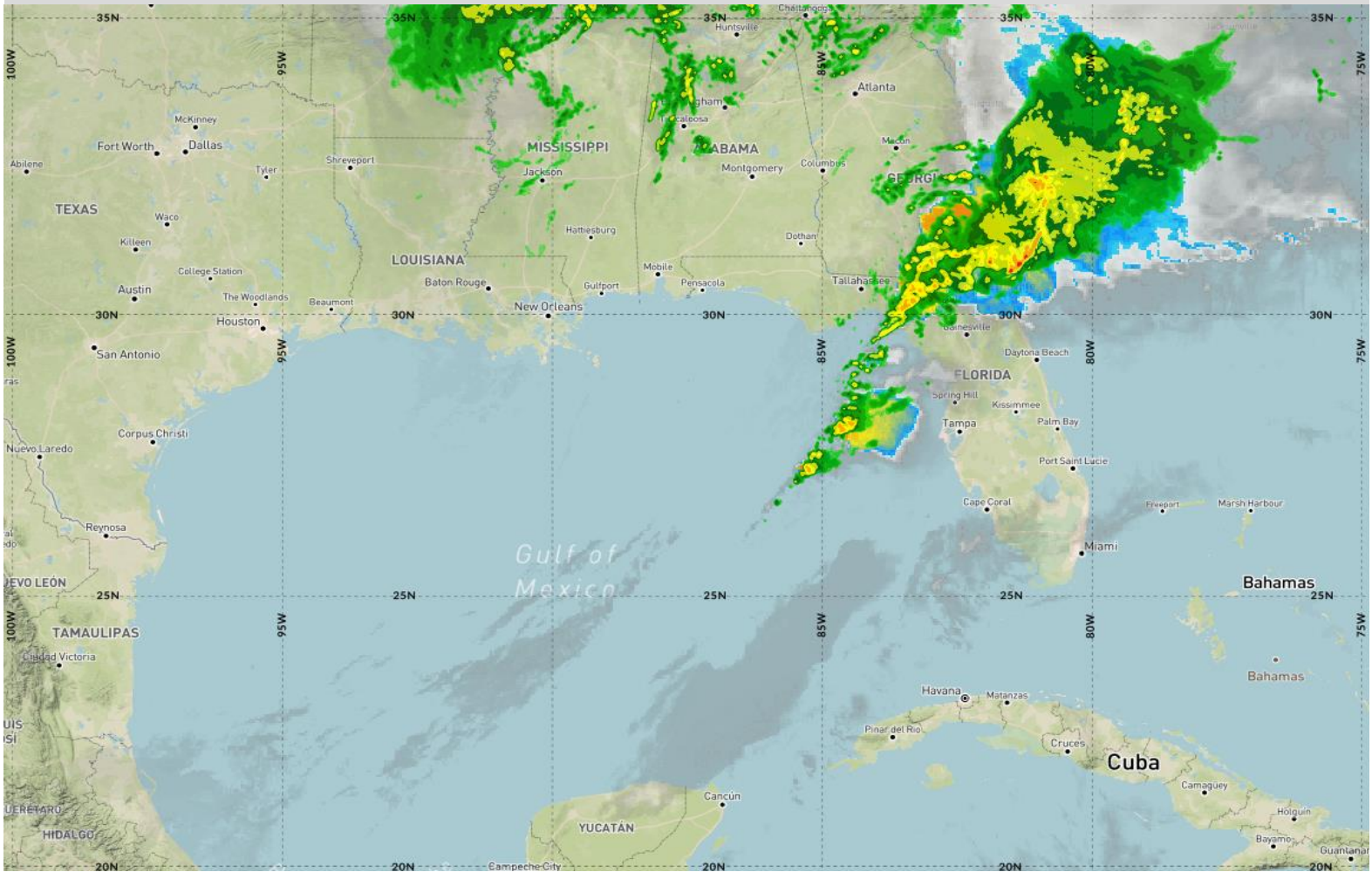

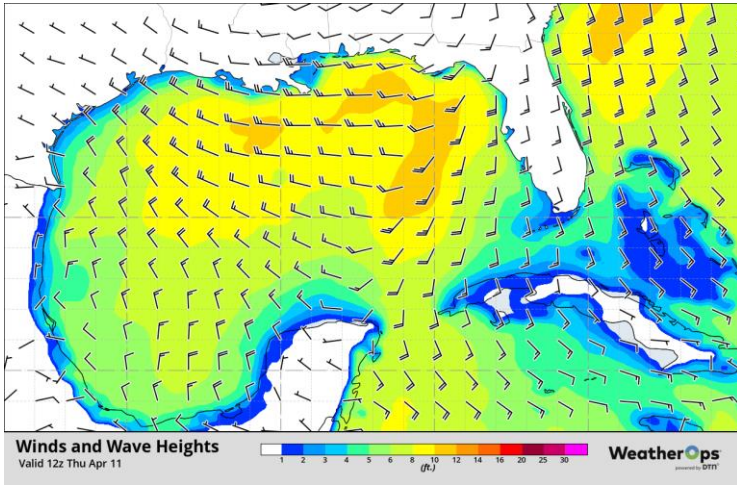
Today and Tomorrow's Weather

Elevated winds and seas will continue today in the wake of a strong cold front. West-northwesterly to northwesterly winds of 20-30 knots with gusts in excess of 40 knots along with rough seas of 7-10 feet (locally higher seas over the deepwaters) are likely through the afternoon before conditions rapidly improve through tomorrow. Winds will continue to veer and will become northerly overnight into Friday and then northeasterly Friday night as high pressure pushes into the basin. Winds will become gentle to moderate with slight seas tomorrow night.

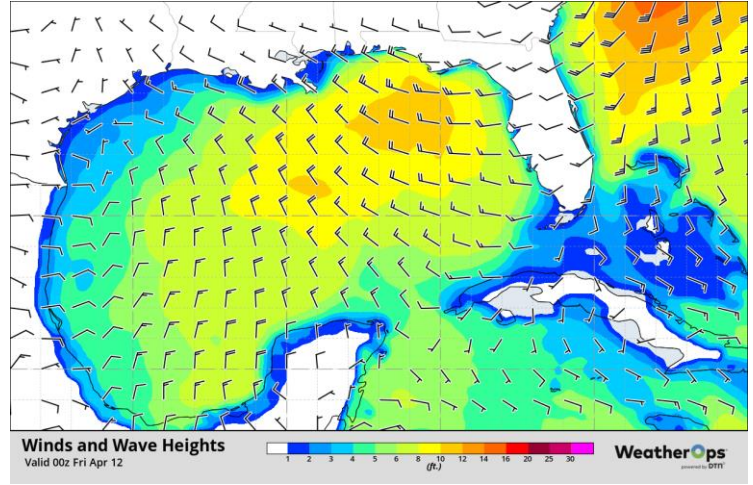
Day Three through Seven Weather Hazards

Clear skies and moderate breezes along with slight seas will persist through the weekend and into early next week with winds becoming southeasterly again. Winds will pick back up Monday evening to moderate/fresh and continuing into the middle of the week with seas building back to moderate at 4-6 feet. Mostly clear skies are expected Days 3-7.

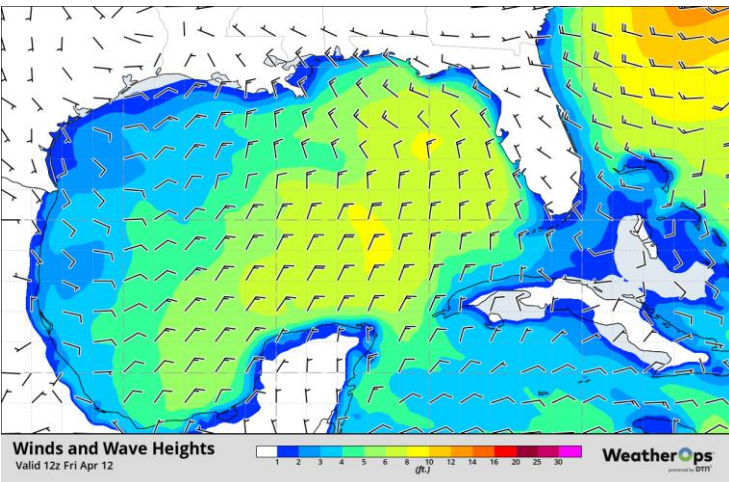
This Morning's Winds and Seas



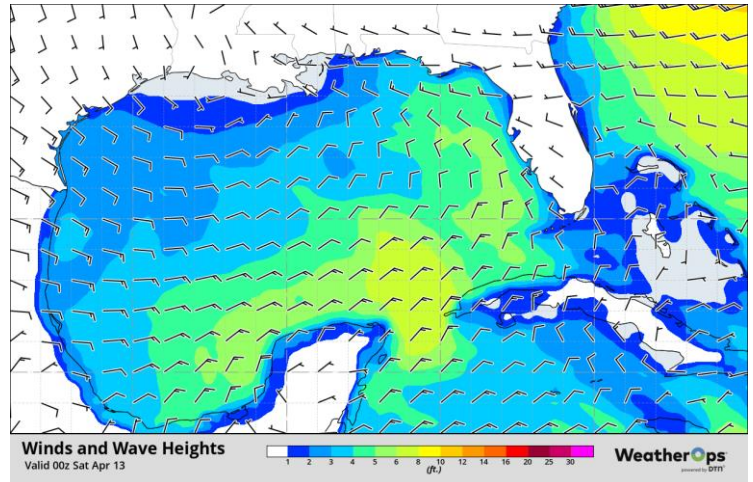
This Evening's Winds and Seas



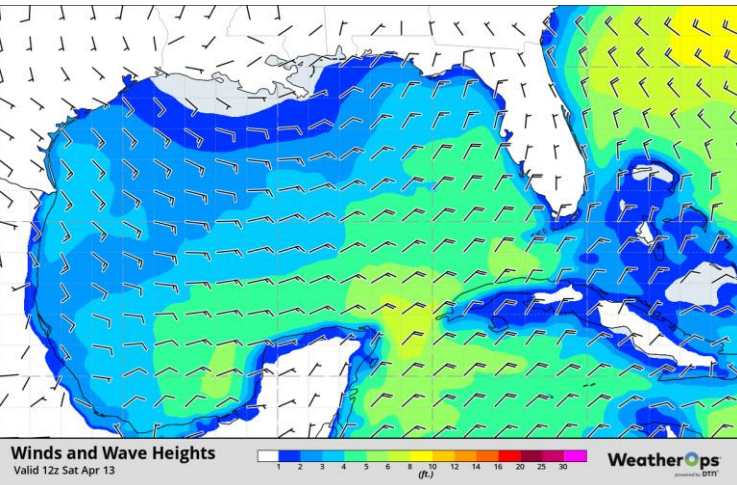
Tomorrow Morning's Winds and Seas



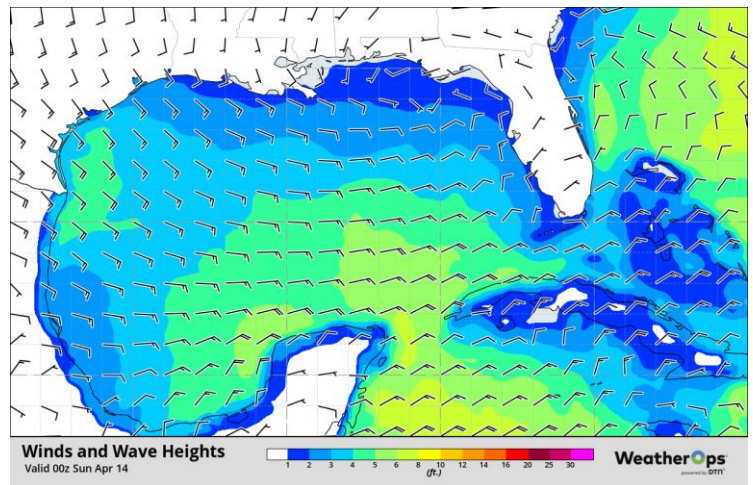
Tomorrow Evening's Winds and Seas



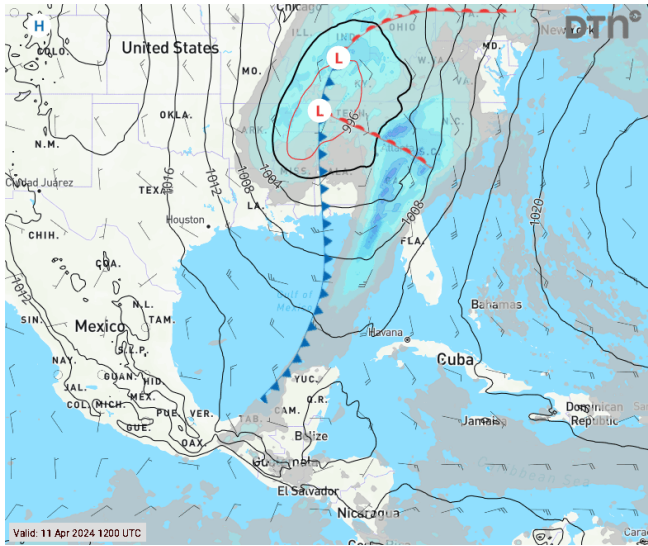
Day 3 Morning Winds and Seas



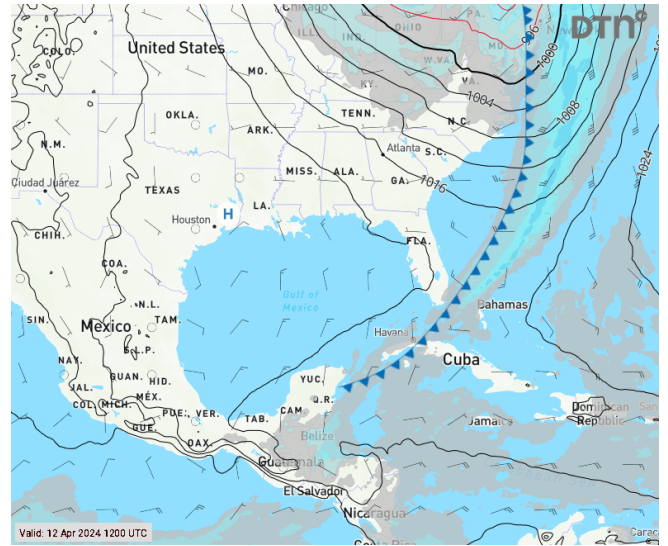
Day 3 Evening Wind and Seas



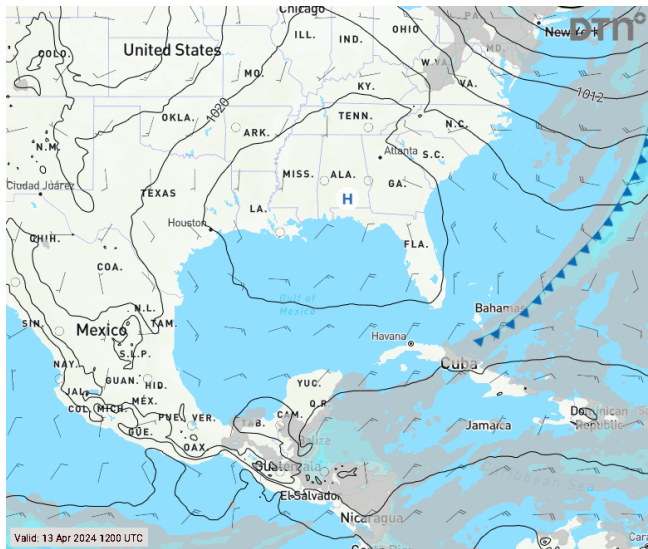
Day 1 Surface Chart



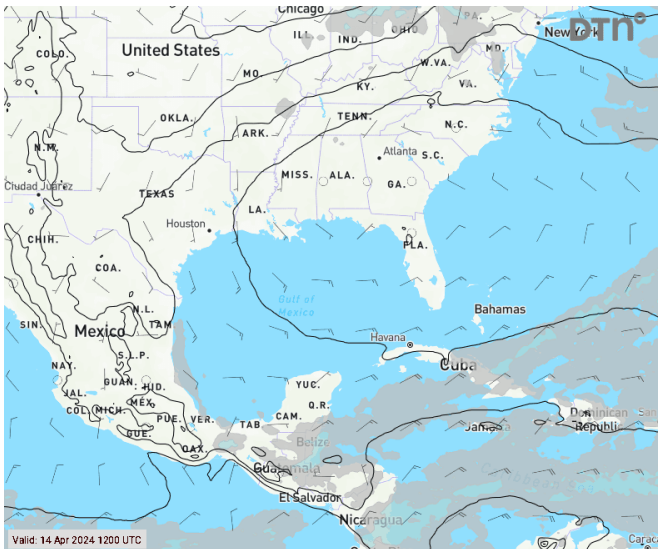
Day 2 Surface Chart



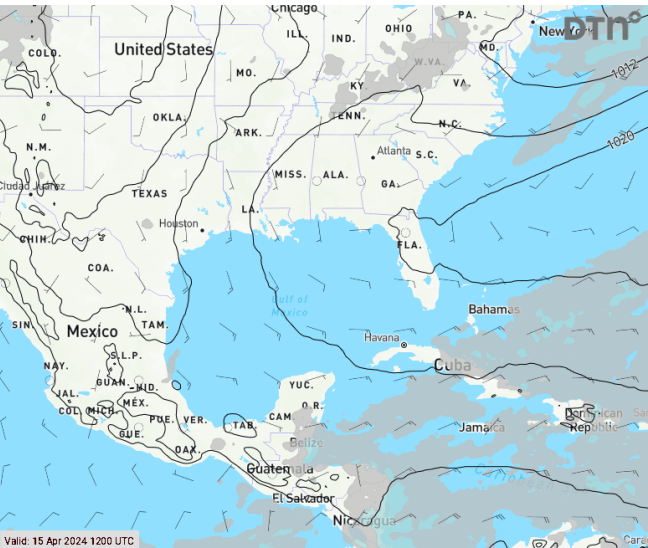
Day 3 Surface Chart
