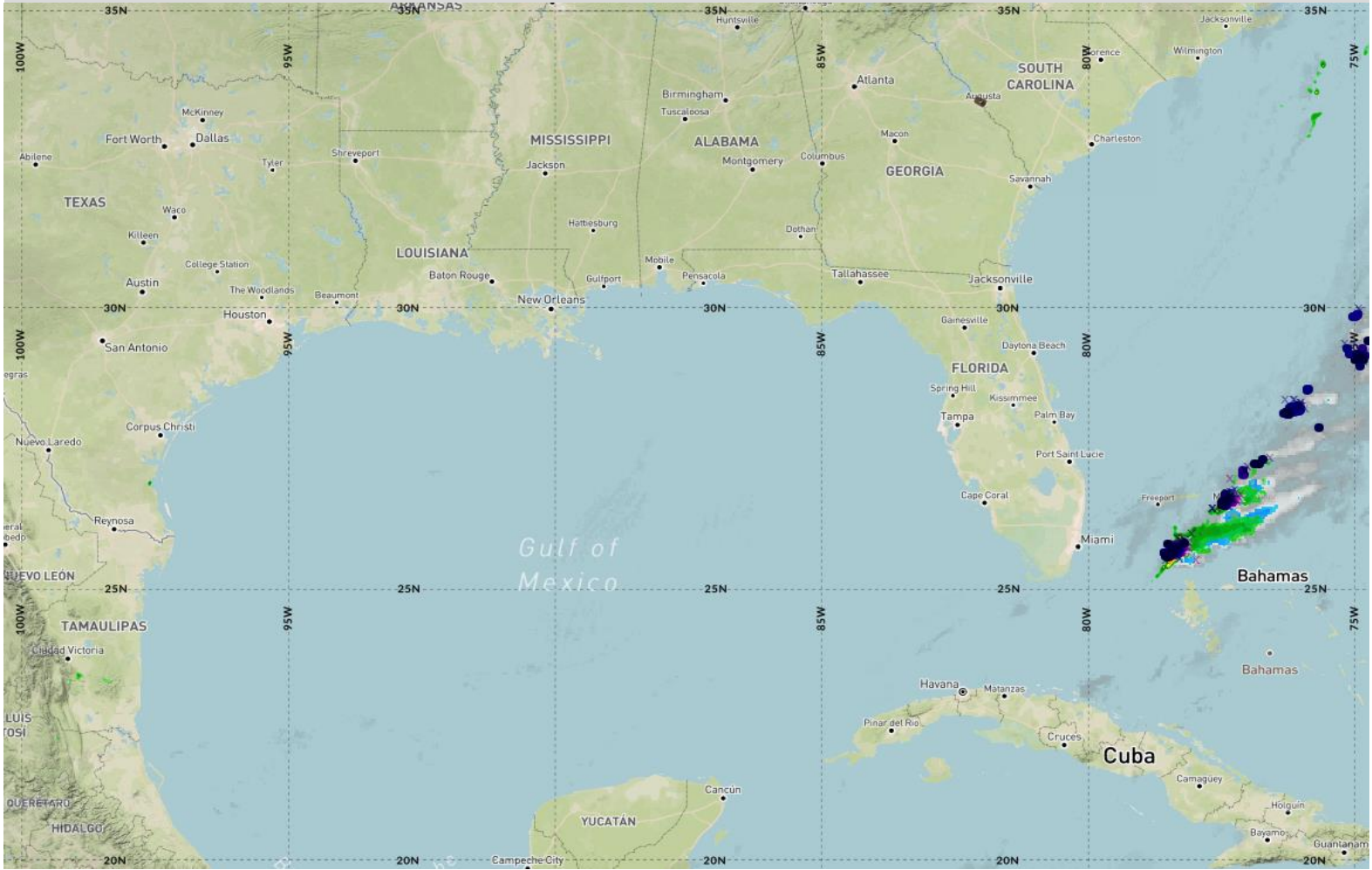

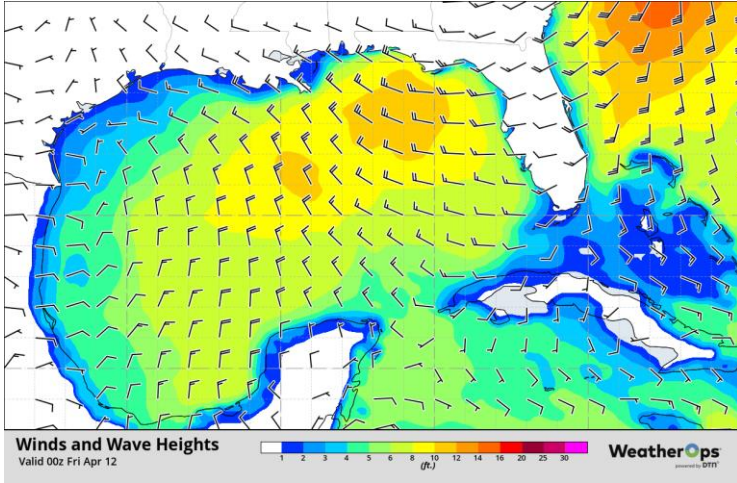
Today and Tomorrow's Weather

As high pressure builds back into the basin, winds will continue to subside. A fresh breezy may persist this morning, but by the afternoon northerly moderate breezes can be expected. Eastern areas will see winds turn out of the northeast and western areas will see winds turn out of the southeast as high pressure moves east along the Gulf Coast. Seas will relax with smooth to slight seas expected today and tomorrow. Deepwaters may still experience 4-6 foot seas. Clear skies are expected.

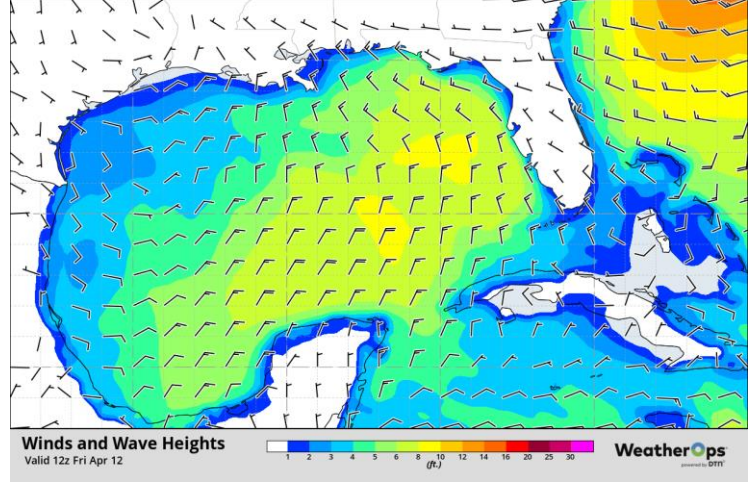
Day Three through Seven Weather Hazards

Clear skies will continue until mid week, when the tail end of a cold front moves through the Gulf. At this time no organized convection is expected along the front. Seas will remain within the 4-6 foot range. Winds will remain out of the southeast at a moderate breeze. As the cold front moves through, fresh to strong breezes are expected. Deepwaters will still experience the highest winds.

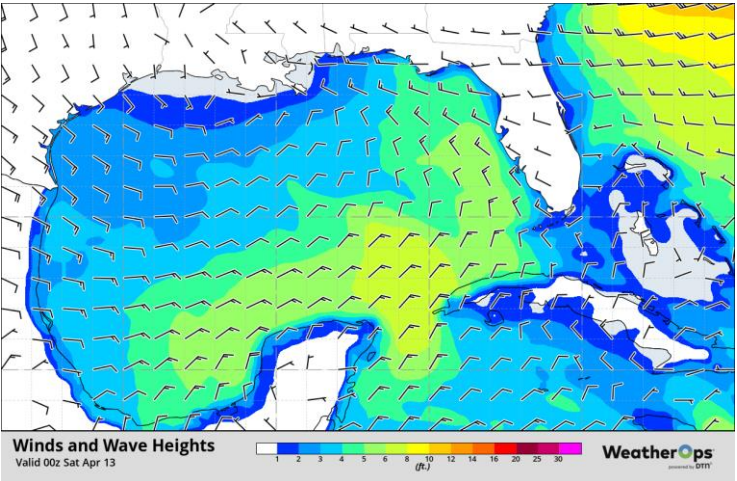
This Morning's Winds and Seas



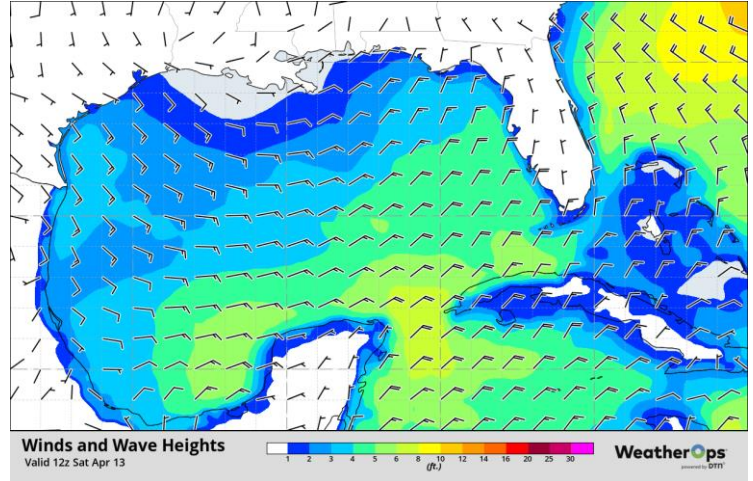
This Evening's Winds and Seas



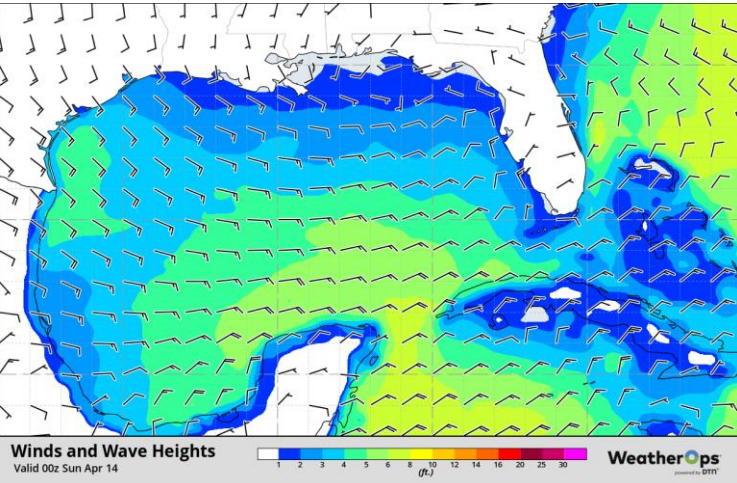
Tomorrow Morning's Winds and Seas



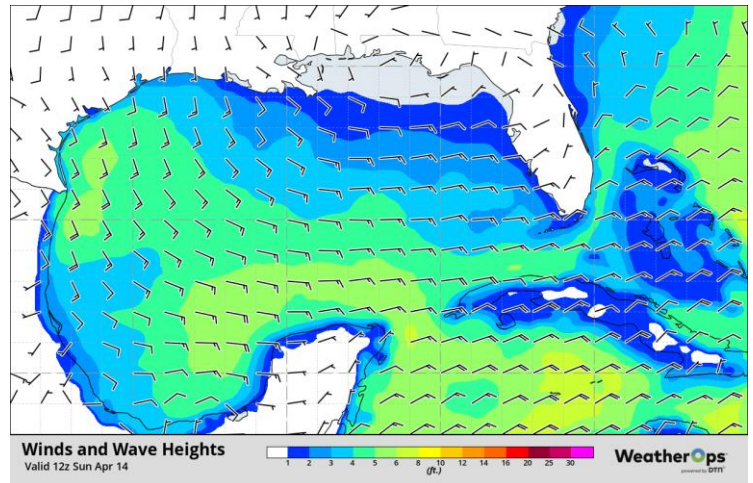
Tomorrow Evening's Winds and Seas



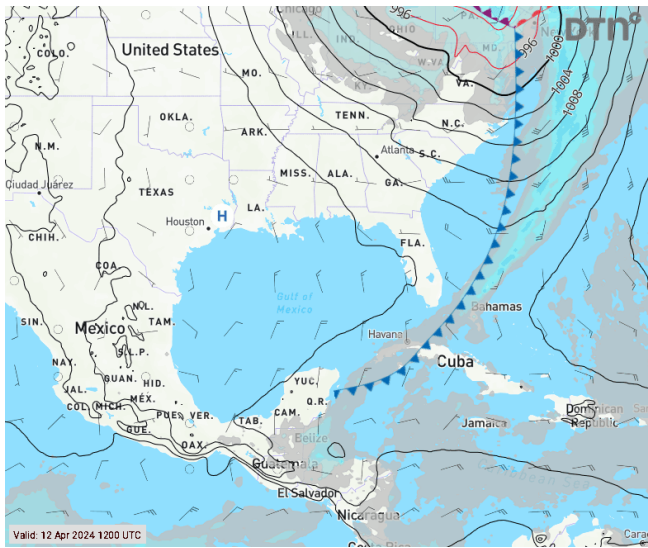
Day 3 Morning Winds and Seas



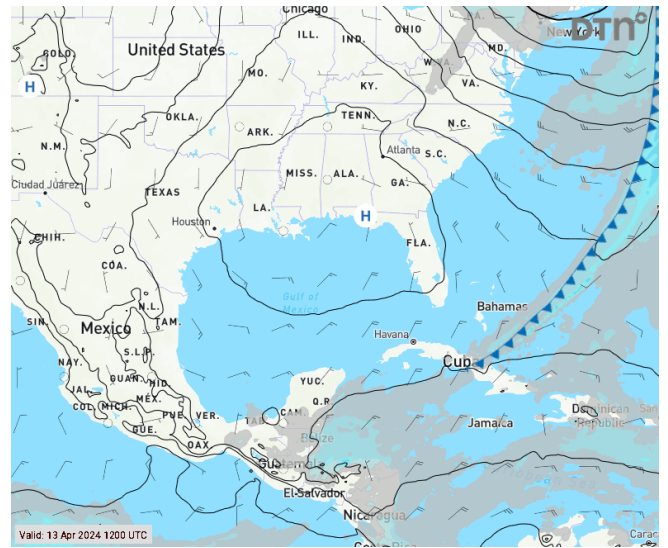
Day 3 Evening Wind and Seas



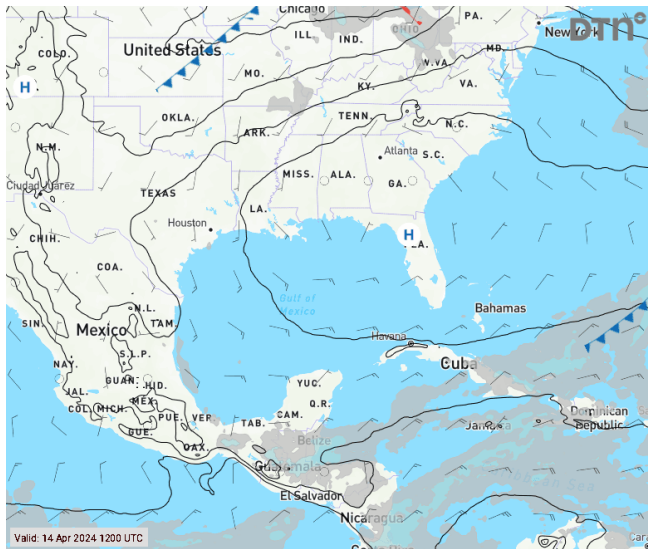
Day 1 Surface Chart



Day 2 Surface Chart



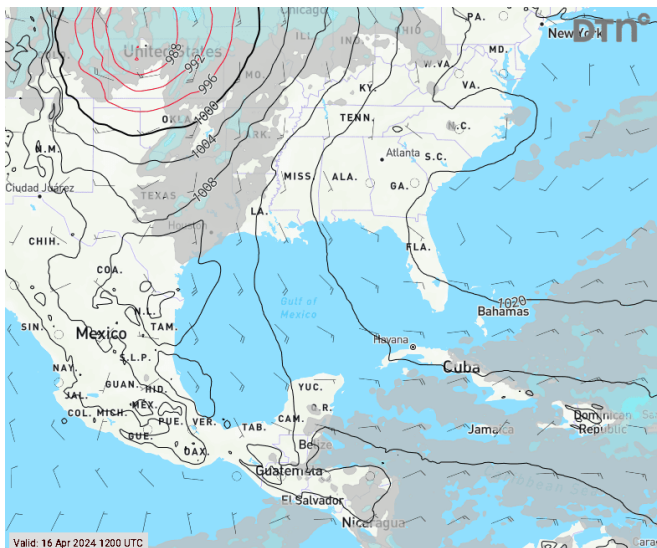
Day 3 Surface Chart
